On April 12, the NJ Department of Transportation (DOT) will close the northbound lanes of the Pulaski Skyway to begin a 2-year, \$1.5 billion renovation project.

Jersey City is actively preparing for the closure by meeting weekly with DOT staff. We are working together to ensure the City has the resources it needs handle additional traffic.

The State's Skyway closure is going to be difficult. City Hall is doing everything it can to minimize disruptions to our residents and businesses. We have prepared a detailed plan and are prepared to adapt as circumstances evolve. We need your help. **Tell us what you see on the streets, and we will work to respond.**

What the State is doing

- Funding JCPD traffic control officers during morning and afternoon rush hours
- Installing almost 2 dozen adaptive traffic signals in Jersey City to accommodate additional 1,700 vehicles on Route 1&9 Truck
- Sharing traffic data with Jersey City to adapt as traffic patterns change
- Opening breakdown lane on Turnpike Extension as third lane during peak hours
- Adding trains during peak hours to 3 NJ Transit heavy rail lines into Hoboken and New York
- Organizing and subsidizing commuter van pools with Hudson County Transportation Management Association
- Providing traffic information to the public on 511NJ.org, pulaskiskyway.com and on Twitter @skywayrehab

What the City is doing

- Deploying at least 50 traffic control officers throughout the city during peak traffic hours
- Deploying Motorcycle Squad to respond rapidly to traffic incidents as they occur
- Working with the school board to help students get to school safely and on-time
- Activating Jersey City Emergency Operations Center on April 12 to manage traffic and emergency responses
- Deploying tow trucks at key locations to quickly move disabled vehicles off roadways
- Adjusting signals, restricting turns and limiting on-street parking to keep traffic moving—and enforcing the new rules
- Carefully monitoring traffic data with DOT to deploy officers to busiest intersections
- Enforcing aggressive driving laws to protect pedestrians
