### TOOLS TO LOCATE AFFORDABLE HOUSING

**Housing Finder** is a FREE and EASY online search tool for finding affordable rental units in Hudson County/Jersey City.

Use **Housing Finder** to locate:

- Affordable rental units
- Landlords who accept housing vouchers
- Disaster relocation services
- Rentals that offer special needs amenities (senior, disability, etc.)
- Lead-safe housing options, and more

The primary objective of the **Jersey City Housing Authority** is to offer and provide qualified, low-income families and senior citizens with the best opportunities for obtaining affordable housing within reasonably safe, working neighborhoods while simultaneously promoting economic self-sufficiency for families, continued independent living for senior citizens, and resonable accommodations for persons with disabilities. These objectives are achieved through their: **Section 8 Program Application**, **Public Housing Program**, **Housing Choice Voucher Programs**, and **Self-Sufficiency Programs**.

The City of Jersey City does not directly rent or sell housing to the public. We work with private and nonprofit developers and their affiliates to create and market affordable housing.

Applying and qualifying for affordable housing can be a long process, and you are not guaranteed to receive housing. Your household must not only qualify with detailed criteria on a property-by-property basis, but you must also be selected at random in that property's lottery. Preferences noted in the advertisement will be given first consideration. If you need immediate housing assistance, or require shelter, please call 2-1-1 or refer to the Homelessness Fact Sheet.
